Interrelate strengthens Aboriginal families in crisis

Through its Aboriginal Building Connections program, relationship experts Interrelate work to improve emotional and developmental outcomes for indigenous kids in separated families.

Interrelate recognises that different cultures have varied ways of dealing with challenging situations, which was the driving force behind Aboriginal Building Connections, a program designed specifically for indigenous communities and taught by Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander workers who are skilled in this field.

Now, with its ever-expanding portfolio of services, Interrelate is offering to train facilitators across Australia to deliver the program.

Across a three-hour session, separated parents will learn:

- the importance of looking after themselves
- the impact that family breakdown and conflict has on kids
- useful tips and strategies to become a more effective parent
- · ways to communicate with the other parent
- · to set goals for future parenting

Participants also gain awareness about the importance of adopting healthy parenting behaviours, and are shown tools and strategies that will give them the skills and confidence to make clear, informed decisions.

Stuart McMinn, Interrelate's Aboriginal RAP Coordinator, notes the importance of such a program.

"Hearing from like-minded people in a culturally appropriate setting is vital to a person's development. In Aboriginal Building Connections, we consider the important roles played by kinship groups and community in the lives of many Aboriginal kids and families."

To do his part for NAIDOC Week 2017, which is currently running with the theme 'Our Languages Matter', McMinn put together an article on the history and intricacies of Aboriginal languages. We encourage you to <u>read it here</u> – it's very
