ELIGIBILITY

TYPES OF SUPPORT

Connect is a **free service** that provides assistance for families, children, and young people where a child or young person's mental health and wellbeing are at risk. We can support you with:

- connecting you with your community and any appropriate services
- access to groups/courses to enhance your skills
- ideas and support to help families deal with challenges and difficulties they may be facing
- liaising with schools and other services to help you get the support you would like

HOW WE WORK

WITH YOU

We will listen and work with you to develop a plan to address the difficulties you are facing. We will meet with you and your child/young person regularly to review where things are at.

You are eligible if the following apply:

- your family has a child or young person aged between 0-18 years
- a consenting adult is willing to work with and support the service
- your family lives within a designated area
- the child/ young person is affected by, or at risk of, mental illness (no formal mental health diagnosis required)
- the child/ young person is in the care of their family, (can't have been placed in the care of the minister)

We offer the following types of support:

- Home visiting
- School visiting
- Assistance to access services within the community
- Short-term support
- Long-term support (6-12 months)
